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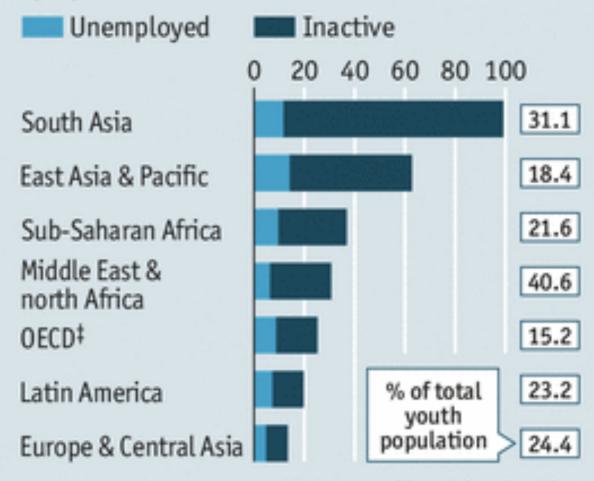

Youth unemployment and inactivity* By region[†], 2012 or latest, m





Adjusted for inflation the average middle-class family earns \$400 less than it did in 1988

Tuition fees increased a record 8.3% in 2012, up 46% over the last decade.

State funding declined a record 9% in 2012, down 30% per student since 2000


Tuition fees as a share of total public university revenue rose 62% over the last decade

7.

In June 2013, total tuition fees discounts exceeded the total amount paid by parents. This is a 50% reduction from posted rates.






