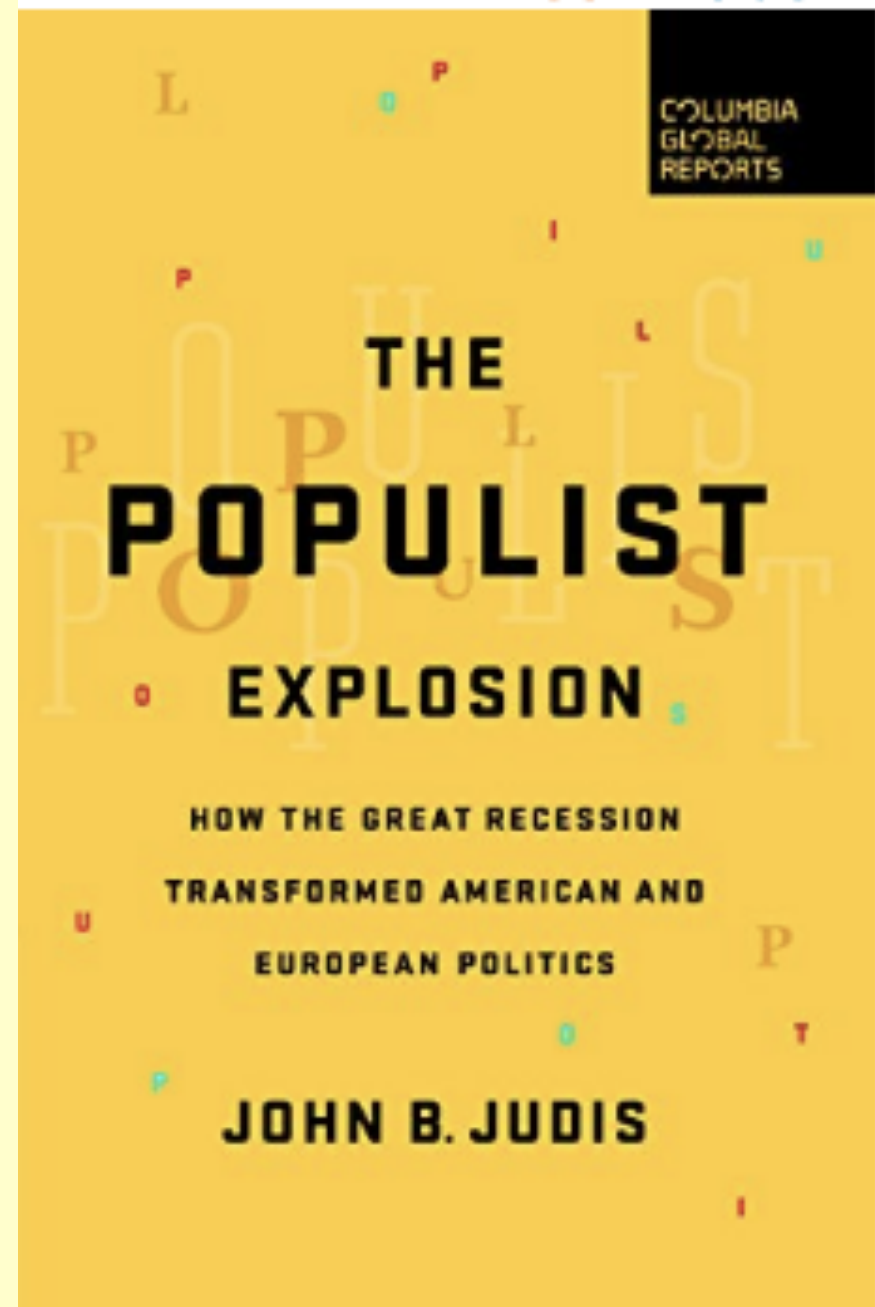


POPULISM
